Further Information about our courses

All e-learning courses and modules are aligned with the National CSTF (Core Skills Training Framework) and Care Certificate learning goals and outcomes. All our courses are CPD certified.

Modules will be fully reviewed and updated every year. We will update a course sooner if significant new evidence emerges such as:

- publication of new/updated national guidance
- new updated national policies or safety information
- new legislation
- other important new evidence, for example from NHS England

Integration with TeamNet

Clarity Training is fully integrated with TeamNet. This means that all courses can be completed and managed within TeamNet without having to navigate away to another website, and no additional login details are needed.

Practice Managers can assign Clarity Training courses to staff from within the Staff Training module, and individual staff can manage and complete their own assigned courses by going to 'My Training'. Details of courses can be viewed here, and when the user is ready, they can select 'Take Course' which will prompt the course to start in a 'pop-out' window. For GPs, Clarity Training courses can also be marked as CPD and be uploaded to their Clarity Appraisals account at the click of a button.

- A range of MCQs and case studies.
- Full range of additional reading and links to relevant resources.
- Easy CQC reporting for the Practice Manager via the Staff Training dashboard.

High-quality secondary evidence from national bodies, such as NHS England, national legislation, Health and Safety Executive, regulators such as Care Quality Commission and General Medical Council identified first, and primary research and expert opinion sought where necessary.

Relevant information

The development process has a number of checks to make sure that the information is relevant and appropriate to primary healthcare professionals:

- thorough scoping and review process
- input from healthcare professionals with extensive primary care experience
- consultation with GPs, pharmacists, lay members
- feedback received from external reviews and user acceptance testing
